Since the CSRP is a Cooperative Research Centre, it possesses a variety of academic, CSIRO and industrial partners that result in a wide variety of resources and expertise being available to a Centre student. Applications for research topics already commenced are welcomed, and the Education Manager and Executive may discuss back-dating the award where appropriate.
